Aaron Hill Presented Players Choice Award for 2009 AL Comeback Player

*In Aaron's honor, the Players Trust contributes \$20,000
to the Child Abuse Prevention Council of the City of Monterey*

New York, NY, Monday, April 12, 2010 ... In a pre-game ceremony this evening, Toronto Blue Jays second baseman Aaron Hill will receive a prestigious Players Choice Award as the 2009 AL Comeback Player. Vernon Wells, Aaron's teammate and a member of the MLBPA's Executive Board, will represent his American League peers in presenting the award to Aaron.

Selected in a secret ballot of all American League players, Aaron receives the Players Choice Award in honor of a fantastic 2009 season. After appearing in just 55 games in 2008, Aaron returned to the lineup full-time last season and set career highs in home runs (36) and RBI (108). He led all Major League second basemen in RBI and led the AL with 734 plate appearances and 682 at-bats.

In Aaron's honor, the Major League Baseball Players Trust has awarded a \$20,000 grant to the Child Abuse Prevention Council of the City of Monterey. 2009 Players Choice Award winners in all categories will designate charities to receive grants totaling \$260,000 from the Players Trust. Since 1992, the Players Trust has recognized the outstanding on-field and off-field performances of Players Choice Awards winners by contributing nearly \$3 million to charities around the world.

Through the Players Trust, Major Leaguers contribute their time, money and celebrity to call attention to important causes affecting the needy and to help encourage others to get involved in their own communities. In partnership with Volunteers of America, the national human service organization, the Players Trust administers the Action Team, a national youth volunteer program currently inspiring the next generation of volunteers in more than 150 high schools in cities throughout the United States.
